SUMMARY ORDER
(Pursuant to K.S.A. 40-4909 and K.S.A. 77-537)

Pursuant to authority granted to the Commissioner of Insurance ("Commissioner") by K.S.A. 40-4909, the Commissioner hereby proposes to find facts and impose sanctions against the nonresident agent's license of James P. Masat ("Respondent") by way of Summary Order as provided by K.S.A. 77-537. This Summary Order shall become effective as a Final Order, without further notice, upon the expiration of the fifteen (15) day period if no request for hearing is made, pursuant to K.S.A. 77-542.

Findings of Fact

The Commissioner finds the following facts from Kansas Insurance Department ("KID") files:

1. Records maintained by the KID indicate that the Respondent is licensed as a nonresident agent to transact the business of insurance in Kansas and has been so licensed since July 7, 1981.
2. KID records further indicate a legal address of P.O. Box 2085, Grand Island, NE 68802-2085.

3. KID has learned that Respondent's Nebraska Resident License was revoked on January 27, 2009.

4. Respondent has not reported to KID the revocation of his resident license.

Applicable Law

5. K.S.A. 40-4909(a) provides, in relevant part:

“The commissioner may deny, suspend, revoke or refuse renewal of any license issued under this act if the commissioner finds that the applicant or license holder has: (2) Violated: (A) Any provision of chapter 40 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto, or any rule and regulation promulgated hereunder (see also 40-4204(1). . .(8) Used any fraudulent, coercive, or dishonest practice, or demonstrated any incompetence, untrustworthiness, or financial irresponsibility in the conduct of business in this state or elsewhere. . .” K.S.A. 40-4909(a).

6. The Commissioner may revoke any license issued under the Insurance Agents Licensing Act if the Commissioner finds that the interests of the insurer or the insurable interests of the public are not properly served under such license. K.S.A. 40-4909(b).

7. Each agent is required to report any disciplinary action of the agent's license within 30 days of said discipline. K.A.R. 40-7-9.

Conclusions of Law

8. The Commissioner has jurisdiction over Respondent as well as the subject matter of this proceeding, and such proceeding is held in the public interest. The Commissioner finds, based on the facts contained in paragraphs 3 and 4, that Respondent has demonstrated incompetence, untrustworthiness, or financial irresponsibility in the conduct of business.

9. Based on the Respondent's conduct and the revocation of his resident license in Nebraska, the Commissioner concludes that sufficient grounds exist for the revocation of Respondent's insurance agent's license pursuant to K.S.A. 40-4909(b) because such license is not properly serving the interests of the insurer and the insurable interests of the public.

10. Based on the facts and circumstances set forth herein, it appears that the use of summary proceedings in this matter is appropriate, in accordance with the provisions set forth in K.S.A. 77-537(a), in that the use of summary proceedings does not violate any provision of the law and the protection of the public interest does not require the KID to give notice and opportunity to participate to persons other than James P. Masat.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED BY THE COMMISSIONER OF INSURANCE THAT the Kansas non-resident insurance agent's license of James P. Masat is hereby **REVOKED. It is further ordered,** that James P. Masat shall **CEASE and DESIST** from the sale, solicitation, or negotiation of insurance and/or receiving compensation deriving from the sale, solicitation, or negotiation of insurance conducted after the effective date of this order.

NOTICE OF RIGHTS
(Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-542)

James P. Masat is entitled to a hearing pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act. If Respondent desires a hearing, he must file a written request for a hearing with:

This request must be filed within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order. If Respondent requests a hearing, the Kansas Insurance Department will notify him of the time and place of the hearing and information on procedures, right of representation, and other rights of parties relating to the conduct of the hearing, before commencement of the same.

If a hearing is not requested in the time and manner stated above, this Summary Order shall become effective as a Final Order upon the expiration of time for requesting a hearing, pursuant to K.S.A. 77-613. In the event Respondent files a Petition for Judicial Review, pursuant to K.S.A. §77-613(e), the agency officer to be served on behalf of the Kansas Insurance Department is:
