SUMMARY ORDER OF REVOCATION

(Pursuant to K.S.A. 40-4909 and K.S.A. 77-501 *et seq.*)

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Commissioner of Insurance ("Commissioner") by K.S.A. 40-4909 and K.S.A. 77-501 *et seq.*, the Commissioner hereby **REVOKES** the Kansas nonresident insurance producer's license of **BRANDI GRIFFIN** ("Respondent"). This Summary Order shall become effective as a Final Order, without further notice, upon the expiration of the fifteen (15) day period if no request for a hearing is made.

Findings of Fact

1. Respondent was licensed as a Kansas nonresident insurance producer on May 10, 2023, and expires February 28, 2026.
2. Respondent's address of record on file with the Kansas Department of Insurance ("Department") is [REDACTED] Riverview, FL 33578-[REDACTED]
3. On May 10, 2023, the Respondent submitted an initial application for a Kansas nonresident insurance producer license to the Department.
4. Respondent answered "No" to Question 1a of the Background Questions on the Application which asks, "Have you been convicted of a misdemeanor, had a judgment withheld or deferred, or are you currently charged with committing a misdemeanor?"
5. As a result of the negative answer on the initial application for licensure, the application was approved and the license was issued to the Respondent.

6. On May 6, 2024, an application for additional line of authority was submitted on behalf of the Respondent for her Kansas nonresident insurance producer license.

7. The authorized submitter on behalf of the Respondent answered “Yes” to Question 1a of the Background Questions on the Application which asks, “Have you been convicted of a misdemeanor, had a judgment withheld or deferred, or are you currently charged with committing a misdemeanor, which has not been previously reported to this insurance department?”

8. Documents were uploaded in connection with Background Question 1a in the NIPR Attachment’s Warehouse disclosing two previous convictions that were not disclosed on the initial application as required.

9. Specifically, the Respondent disclosed and uploaded documentation for a misdemeanor disturbing the peace conviction out of the Lee’s Summit Municipal Court, Missouri, on June 15, 2011, and a misdemeanor endangering the welfare of a child conviction out of the Lyon County District Court, Kansas, on July 26, 2010.

10. The Department offered the Respondent a Consent Order to address the violations of providing incorrect, misleading, incomplete or untrue information in the license application process on July 2, 2024. This Consent Order was offered in lieu of revoking the Respondent’s license. Initially, the Respondent indicated that she would enter into the Consent Order and requested additional time to pay the penalty.

11. Respondent never returned the Consent Order nor paid the penalty.

12. The Respondent’s providing incorrect, misleading, incomplete or untrue information in the initial license application process indicates that the insurable interests of the public are no longer served by the Respondent’s license.

Applicable Law

K.S.A. 40-4909(a)(1) provides:

The Commissioner may deny, suspend, revoke or refuse renewal of any license issued under this act if the Commissioner finds that the applicant or license holder has provided incorrect, misleading, incomplete or untrue information in the license application.

K.S.A. 40-4909(b) provides:

The Commissioner may deny, suspend, revoke or refuse renewal of any license issued under this act if the Commissioner finds that the interests of the insurer or the insurable interests of the public are not properly served under such license.

Policy Reasons

1. It is in the public interest that the license of a producer who provides incorrect, misleading, incomplete or untrue information in the license application process be revoked.

Conclusions of Law

1. The Commissioner has jurisdiction over **BRANDI GRIFFIN** as well as the subject matter of this proceeding, and such proceeding is held in the public interest.

2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 40-4909(a) and (b), the Commissioner finds that the insurable interests of the public are no longer properly served under the Kansas nonresident insurance producer's license of **BRANDI GRIFFIN**.

3. Pursuant to K.S.A. 40-4909(a) and (b), the Commissioner concludes that sufficient grounds exist for revocation of the Kansas nonresident insurance producer's license of **BRANDI GRIFFIN**.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED BY THE COMMISSIONER OF INSURANCE THAT:

1. The Kansas nonresident insurance producer's license of **BRANDI GRIFFIN** is hereby **REVOKED** the effective date of this Order.

2. **IT IS FURTHER ORDERD** that **BRANDI GRIFFIN** shall **CEASE** and **DESIST** from the sale, solicitation or negotiation of insurance in Kansas and/or receiving compensation deriving from the sale, solicitation or negotiation of insurance in Kansas conducted after the effective date of this Order.

NOTICE AND OPPORTUNITY FOR HEARING

BRANDI GRIFFIN, within fifteen (15) days of service (plus 3 additional days for service by mail) of this Summary Order, you shall file with the Kansas Department of Insurance a written request for hearing on this Summary Order, as provided by K.S.A. 77-542. In the event a hearing is requested, such request should be directed to:

Any costs incurred as a result of conducting any administrative hearing shall be assessed against the producer/agency who is the subject of the hearing as provided by K.S.A. 40-4909(g). Costs shall include witness fees, mileage allowances, any costs associated with reproduction of documents which become part of the hearing record, and the expense of making a record of the hearing.

If a hearing is not requested, this Summary Order shall become effective as a Final Order, without further notice, upon the expiration of the fifteen (15) day (with an additional three (3) days for service by mail) period for requesting a hearing. The Final Order will constitute final agency action on the matter.

In the event the Respondent files a petition for judicial review, the agency officer designated pursuant to K.S.A. 77-613(e) to receive service of a petition for judicial review on behalf of the Kansas Department of Insurance is:
