## **ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION** **ORDER OF REVOCATION**

Re: Revocation of Kansas Nonresident Insurance Producer License, NPN 18966457

Dear **Jason Luse**:

This letter is notification your Kansas nonresident insurance producer license is **REVOKED** due to the **license fees submitted on or about April 2, 2025, being returned unpaid.**

K.S.A. 40-4909 gives the Commissioner authority to revoke your insurance producer's license if you have violated any provision of chapter 40 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated. K.S.A. 40-4905 and K.S.A. 40-4906 require any person (K.S.A. 40-4902(t) defines person as person or business entity) to obtain a license with the Kansas Department of Insurance in order to sell, solicit or negotiate insurance within the state of Kansas. In order to obtain that license, an insurance agent is required to have submitted to the commissioner a nonrefundable application/license fee. In addition, K.S.A. 40-4909(a)(8) allows the Commissioner to revoke a license if it is found that the licensee used any fraudulent, coercive, or dishonest practice, or demonstrated any incompetence, untrustworthiness or **financial irresponsibility** in the conduct of business in this state or elsewhere. Due to the nonpayment of your application/licensing fee, which was a prerequisite to obtaining your license, your Kansas Nonresident Insurance Producer License is hereby revoked.

In addition, K.S.A. 40-4909(a)(17) allows the Commissioner to revoke an insurance producer's license if the Commissioner finds that the license holder has failed to respond to an inquiry from the Commissioner within 15 business days. On June 20, 2025, the Commissioner, through Department staff, sent an inquiry to your mailing address and e-mail address(es) of record on file with the Department regarding the termination of your business relationship for cause by various insurers. This inquiry instructed you that a written, detailed response to the termination for cause action was required within 15 business days. On July 16, 2025, the Department sent to your email address(es) of record on file a late notice regarding this matter again instructing you that a written response was required within five business days. You failed to respond

to that inquiry as well. All correspondences regarding these inquiries notified you that action could be taken against the insurance producer's license if the producer fails to respond to the inquiry. To date, the Department still has not received your response to the inquiries. Due to your failure to respond, the Commissioner concludes that sufficient grounds exist to revoke the Kansas resident insurance producer license of **JASON LUSE**.

**This revocation constitutes an administrative action which you will be required to disclose on all future licensing applications.** You may also be required to report this administrative action to any other state where you are currently licensed, in accordance with the requirements of each state.

You have a right to a hearing before the Assistant Commissioner of Insurance to contest this decision to revoke your Kansas nonresident insurance producer license. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, within fifteen (15) days of the date of this letter (plus an additional three days for service by mail), you shall submit a written request for an appeal. A request for a hearing should be addressed to the following:

If you request a hearing, the Kansas Department of Insurance will serve notice of the time and place of the hearing and information on procedures, right of representation, and other rights of parties relating to the conduct of the hearing. Any costs incurred as a result of conducting any administrative hearing shall be assessed against the agent/agency who is the subject of the hearing as provided by K.S.A. 40-4909(g).

If a hearing is not requested, this letter shall become effective as a Final Order, without further notice, upon the expiration of the fifteen (15) day period for requesting a hearing. The Final Order will constitute final agency action in the matter.

In the event you file a petition for judicial review with the District Court, the agency officer designated pursuant to K.S.A. 77-613(e) to receive service of a petition for judicial review on behalf of the Kansas Insurance Department is:
