SUMMARY ORDER OF REVOCATION

(Pursuant to K.S.A. 40-4909 and K.S.A. 77-501 et seq.)

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Commissioner of Insurance ("Commissioner") by K.S.A. 40-4909 and K.S.A. 77-501 *et seq.*, the Commissioner hereby **REVOKES** the Kansas nonresident insurance producer's license of **DARRYL ROBINSON II** ("Respondent"). This Summary Order shall become effective as a Final Order, without further notice, upon the expiration of the fifteen (15) day period if no request for a hearing is made.

Findings of Fact

- Respondent was licensed as a Kansas nonresident insurance producer on January
 4, 2024, and expires December 31, 2026.
- 2. Respondent's address of record on file with the Kansas Department of Insurance ("Department") is Pembroke Pines, FL 33029.
- 3. On January 4, 2024, Respondent submitted a Kansas nonresident insurance producer license application ("Initial Application") to the Department.
- 4. Respondent answered "No" to Question 1a of the Background Questions on the Application which asks, "Have you been convicted of a misdemeanor, had a judgment withheld or deferred, or are you currently charged with committing a misdemeanor?" As a result of the negative answers to the background questions on the initial application, the application automatically processed and the license was approved.

- 5. On March 24, 2025, Respondent submitted an application for an additional line(s) of authority to the Department.
- 6. Respondent answered "Yes" to Question 1a of the Background Questions on the Application which asks, "Have you been convicted of a misdemeanor, had a judgment withheld or deferred, or are you currently charged with committing a misdemeanor?"
- 7. Upon the Department's review of the documentation submitted with the lines of authority application, it was determined that Respondent was charged with a misdemeanor and received an adjudication withheld on September 22, 2022.
- 8. Specifically, the Respondent was charged with Discharging a Firearm in Public occurring on or about March 26, 2021. On or about September 22, 2022, the Respondent received an adjudication withheld for the misdemeanor charge, in Broward County Court 17th Judicial Circuit, Florida, Case Number 21003401MM10A. This charge should have been disclosed on the initial application.
- 9. The providing incorrect, misleading, incomplete or untrue information in the initial application process and the recency, seriousness and nature of the conduct underlying the criminal charges indicate that the insurable interests of the public are no longer served by the Respondent's license.

Applicable Law

K.S.A. 40-4909(a)(1) provides:

The Commissioner may deny, suspend, revoke or refuse renewal of any license issued under this act if the commissioner finds that the applicant or license holder has provided incorrect, misleading, incomplete or untrue information in the license application.

K.S.A. 40-4909(b) provides:

The Commissioner may deny, suspend, revoke or refuse renewal of any license issued under this act if the Commissioner finds that the interests of the insurer or the insurable interests of the public are not properly served under such license.

Policy Reasons

- 1. It is in the public interest that the license of a producer who has provided incorrect, misleading, incomplete or untrue information in the license application be revoked.
- 2. It is in the public interest that the license of a producer who has had a recent misdemeanor, of this type, circumstance and resolution be revoked, as the conduct underlying this charge is of a nature that the insurable interest of the public is no longer served by this license.

Conclusions of Law

- 1. The Commissioner has jurisdiction over **DARRYL ROBINSON II** as well as the subject matter of this proceeding, and such proceeding is held in the public interest.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 40-4909(a) and (b), the Commissioner finds that the insurable interests of the public are no longer properly served under the Kansas resident insurance producer's license of **DARRYL ROBINSON II**.
- Pursuant to K.S.A. 40-4909(a) and (b), the Commissioner concludes that sufficient grounds exist for revocation of the Kansas nonresident insurance producer's license of DARRYL ROBINSON II.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED BY THE COMMISSIONER OF INSURANCE THAT:

The Kansas nonresident insurance producer's license of **DARRYL ROBINSON** II is hereby **REVOKED** the effective date of this Order.

2. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that DARRYL ROBINSON II shall CEASE and DESIST from the sale, solicitation or negotiation of insurance in Kansas and/or receiving compensation deriving from the sale, solicitation or negotiation of insurance in Kansas conducted after the effective date of this Order.

NOTICE AND OPPORTUNITY FOR HEARING

DARRYL ROBINSON II, within fifteen (15) days of service (plus 3 additional days for service by mail) of this Summary Order, you shall file with the Kansas Department of Insurance a written request for hearing on this Summary Order, as provided by K.S.A. 77-542. In the event a hearing is requested, such request should be directed to:

Any costs incurred as a result of conducting any administrative hearing shall be assessed against the producer/agency who is the subject of the hearing as provided by K.S.A. 40-4909(g). Costs shall include witness fees, mileage allowances, any costs associated with reproduction of documents which become part of the hearing record, and the expense of making a record of the hearing.

If a hearing is not requested, this Summary Order shall become effective as a Final Order, without further notice, upon the expiration of the fifteen (15) day (with an additional three (3) days for service by mail) period for requesting a hearing. The Final Order will constitute final agency action on the matter.

In the event the Respondent files a petition for judicial review, the agency officer designated pursuant to K.S.A. 77-613(e) to receive service of a petition for judicial review on behalf of the Kansas Department of Insurance is:
