K.A.R. 40-7-13. Agents; scope, subclassification; type and conduct of examinations;
reexamination. (a) The licensing examination for each agent shall test the applicant's knowledge
in the following areas:
(1) The laws of Kansas, including:
(A) pertinent provisions of the statutes of Kansas; and
(B) rules and regulations of the insurance-department of insurance;
(2) general insurance, including:
(A) duties and responsibilities of a licensed agent; and
(B) basic insurance knowledge; and
(3) the specific classes or subclasses of insurance for which application is made.
(b) For examination purposes, the classifications and subclassifications of insurance shall
be as follows:
Class Subclass
(1) Life insurance;
(2) <u>accident and health insurance</u> ;
(3) casualty insurance <u>and allied lines</u> title insurance and bail bonds;

crop insurance

(4) property insurance and allied lines

- (c) Each applicant shall take the required examination through the vendor(s) designated by the commissioner. The vendor(s) designated by the commissioner may also provide each applicant study materials, prepare examinations covering the required topics, and conduct the required examinations.
- (d) Persons failing to score at least 70 percent on any examination shall have failed that examination and shall not be qualified for a license for that class or subclass. Each applicant failing to satisfactorily complete any examination, may in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 40-241, and amendments thereto, retake the examination following a waiting period of not less than seven (7) days from the date of the most recent attempt. Notification of the result of each examination shall be provided to the applicant only.
- (e) Each applicant's passing examination score shall be valid for two years from the date of the examination.
 - (d)(f) Examinations shall be conducted as follows:
- (1) Each applicant shall be advised of eligibility for examination by the commissioner or the commissioner's designee.
- (2) The Each applicant's licensing application shall remain effective for a period of one year from the date received.
